Pastor's Ponderings

Worshipping Together

For the first time in the history of our congregation we will have a live worship service shared on our computers. I will be preaching to an almost completely empty sanctuary.

Giving a sermon is not the same thing as giving a lecture. A sermon is a conversation between the congregation and the minister. John Calvin said that a proper sermon is one that is rightly spoken and rightly heard. He added that both have to take place for true worship to occur.

Granted, the minister does most of the communicating but the congregation also communicates through body language. Ministers clue into the feedback they receive from the congregation. A preacher might notice confused looks, people taking notes, heads nodding in agreement or heads nodding off. Preachers will notice people nudging each other in the pew to communicate, 'hey, did you hear that?'

As Presbyterians we are nicknamed the frozen chosen. We aren't as animated in our worship as other denominations, such as Pentecostal Christians. When I lived in Chicago, I enjoyed attending worship at a few African American Churches. I heard a lot of enthusiastic proclamations of Amen! And Praise the Lord!

I once preached at one of the churches. My father was a principal of a school in inner city Chicago near the Abling Housing Projects by Maxwell Street. He and I were attending a funeral service for one of his teachers. Somehow, someone knew I was a seminary student. From the pulpit, the head pastor introduced me to the congregation by telling everyone that I was a minister. To my surprise, he called me forward to say some words. I hadn't had any preaching classes yet or any experience preaching. I silently said a prayer while I walked forward to the pulpit. Trusting in the Holy Spirit, I just spoke from the heart. The congregation responded as I spoke. Their communication helped guide my thoughts and inspire my message.

You have a role in sharing the Good News on Sunday mornings. Our congregation is very engaged during worship. People want to be there. I notice how you absorb God's presence.

For the moment, I will be preaching to an almost empty church but I will see you in my mind. I know where everyone typically sits. I know who sits in the back, the middle and up closer either on the pulpit side or on the choir side. I know who sits closer to the window or near the center isle of the pew. I'll see specific individual faces in the pews, right where you belong on Sunday mornings.

I miss our gatherings for Sunday worship. I miss seeing your faces, hearing your voices, joining with you in our singing, and listening to your prayers of joy or concerns and later gathering for coffee hour. When it is safe, we will return. Until then, stay safe, faithful, and healthy.

Per Capita

Our Per Capita for 2020 is \$50 – if you give electronically, please tell Linda Bracht what is the amount and when you would like the church to take the per capita – she does not take it automatically.

What is Per Capita? In essence, per capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that is paid to the Presbytery of Geneva, the Synod of the Northeast, and the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Just as a train cannot move without an engine, our church councils require a power source to enable them to provide basic services which support our mutual mission as the Body of Christ. Per capita covers the ecclesiastical expenses of the denomination: the coordination and evaluation of mission, and the performance of ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions. Per capita is an opportunity for all members of the Presbyterian church to participate equally, responsibly, and interdependently by sharing the organizational costs of the larger church.

What does the Book of Order say about Per Capita? "Each council above the session shall prepare a budget annually for its operating expenses, including administrative personnel, and may fund it with a per capita apportionment among the particular churches within its bounds. Presbyteries are responsible for raising their own funds and for the timely transmission of per capita funds to their respective synods and to General Assembly. Presbyteries may direct per capita apportionments to the sessions within their bounds but in no case, shall the authority of the session to direct its benevolences be comprised." (G-3.0106)

How is per capita paid to the Synod and General Assembly in the Presbytery of Geneva? Different denominations have different ways of collecting revenue. Some receive a "head tax" of more than \$50 per member. Others receive a certain percentage of a congregation's receipts (up to 25%). In the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), per capita is an obligation of the Presbytery. The Presbytery of Geneva affirms the interdependent nature of our church by allocating funds in the annual operating budget for Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly per capita regardless of income from the churches.

What are the consequences if a Church does not contribute to the Presbytery? The majority of congregations in the Presbytery generously contribute funds every year. When particular churches do not contribute, a greater burden of responsibility is placed on sister churches in the Presbytery to fund our mutual mission including our partnership with Synod and General Assembly. Per capita establishes a minimum level of financial participation in the vital work of our connectional church as the Body of Christ, strengthening the sense of community

among all Presbyterians. It is a moral obligation we share with one another. Some sessions encourage each member to contribute per capita beyond regular giving to the church. For more information about per capita: http://oga.pcusa.org/section/departments/per-capita/frequently-asked-questions/

Presbytery of Geneva Letter from our Leadership Team from May 23rd

Presbytery Friends,

Following the announcement on Friday, May 22nd from the White House about reopening our churches, your Presbytery Leadership has received a great many questions about what this means for congregations and other ministry groups in the Presbytery of Geneva. While our buildings may be closed, the Church is not closed. Our many ministries are not closed. The Church is not the building; the Church is the people.

Here is what was shared with CBS News from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Office of the Stated Clerk on May 22, 2020: "The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is committed to the health and safety of all people as we face this worldwide pandemic. Over the last few months, we have seen COVID-19 cripple the economy, cause suffering and death in our families, and force churches to find new ways to be the church. The church is, and has always been, more than a building. Congregations are using new and creative ways to share the gospel and minister to those in need. We are not for rushing people back into the pews when this virus is still claiming victims. When people can go to church without fear of infection, we will be ready."

The members of the Leadership Team have been amazed at the energy, intelligence, imagination and love that sessions and churches have poured into their ministries during this time. Many of our churches are conducting worship services online. Congregations are finding creative ways to stay connected and support one another, even as they remain physically distant. Ministries that provide food, basic necessities, prayer, and comfort have continued to serve as Christ's hands and feet here in the Finger Lakes, even in the midst of this global pandemic. Even with our buildings closed, the essential work of the People of God has continued.

Please do not feel pressured to reopen your buildings. We must continue to discern what it means to be the Body of Christ. We must continue to consider who comprises the members of the Body and the value of all we bring when we gather -- including our age, health, and ability. What does it mean to the Body if we choose to move forward knowing that many members of it have to opt out? What does choosing to do so say to the world?

We commend to you the guidance from the Wisconsin Council of Churches on phased reopening, the practical and theological guidance from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), as well as the list of 24 questions for Sessions to consider as they begin to plan. All of these documents can be found on the Presbytery's COVID-19 resources page. We also commend to you the recent statement on Church Music and COVID-19 from the Presbyterian Association of Musicians, which contains many helpful links about music as well as broader concerns surrounding reopening safely. As of this letter the CDC hasn't officially offered any new guidance to faith communities.

As RE Dr. Rob Anderson, Chair of our General Council, said in his most recent letter: "We must be patient with this. We are all eager to see loved ones, both family and church family. However, rushing back will make transmission much easier. Asymptomatic spread remains a major concern, and the long incubation period makes it easy to transmit. This is the reason that we continue to encourage that even as the phases progress, congregations use caution. Presbytery Leadership is recommending that church buildings remain closed and communities refrain from holding in-person worship and other group gatherings until Phase 4."

Let us be reminded of these words from the Foundations of Presbyterian Polity which begin our Book of Order and ground us firmly in the Reformed tradition of faith:

F-3.0101 God Is Lord of the Conscience

- a. That "God alone is Lord of the conscience, and hath left it free from the doctrines and commandments of men which are in anything contrary to his Word, or beside it, in matters of faith or worship."
- b. Therefore we consider the rights of private judgment, in all matters that respect religion, as universal and unalienable: We do not even wish to see any religious constitution aided by the civil power, further than may be necessary for protection and security, and at the same time, be equal and common to all others.

It is our Sessions -- made up of elected Ruling Elders, together with the Ministers of Word and Sacrament -- who make decisions regarding the life and worship of congregations as well as the ministries and mission engagement with the world. The Session is responsible to do this in ways that measure the congregation's fidelity to the Word of God, as well as to promote its safety and well being.

Please continue to pray for your Presbytery -- for our congregations, our sessions, our pastors -- as well as for our communities, our state, and our nation. We invite you to participate in the Presbytery Meeting on May 26th (happening on Zoom; register for the meeting here), where RE Dr. Rob Anderson will be offering an update informed by his medical experience and expertise. With the Spirit of God working through us and watching over us, we will continue to study the Word, worship, pray, and serve others.
