Pastor's Ponderings

Our Active and Inspiring Church

During the month of October, many good things are happening at church.

Special events are taking place that will provide assistance to people in our community. The Yates Bundle Up program will be held in Crosier Hall on Friday, October 7 from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Children who are Yates County residents will receive a coat, hat, and gloves as inventory supplies last. Warm clothes for winter will be provided free of charge for newborns up to grade 12.

A Mystery Dinner Fundraiser for the Living Well will be held on Friday, October 14 and Saturday October 15 at 7:00 p.m. Music from the 1920s and 1930s will be featured as people solve a who-dun-nit mystery while eating a delicious meal. The Living Well is a ministry sponsored by the Penn Yan Area Council of Churches and the United Methodist area churches. The Living Well's latest outreach program will help families and individuals with cancer support services.

PathStone meets with clients each Thursday in the Robert's Room to provide resources for people looking for affordable housing. PathStone's mission is to strengthen farm workers, along with rural and urban communities through economic and social resources.

The church also hosts Girls Club, an after school program that meets in Crosier Hall on Thursdays from 3:00 to 4:30 p.m. Idelle Dillon leads this important program for adolescents.

The Exercise Group meets Monday, Wednesday, and Friday in Crosier Hall from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. Not only is The Exercise Group a fun and healthy bunch, they are also very generous. Each month they take a free will offering that has provided hundreds of dollars to local charities.

The church is also a place for inspiration and worship. Every Wednesday the Bible Study group meets for prayer, reading and discussion. In October we are studying the New Testament book of Hebrews which emphasizes the importance of Jesus' humanity and his divinity. There will also be an Adult Study Group meeting in Crosier Hall before worship on Sunday from 9:15 to 10:15 a.m. Additionally, Choir rehearsal, which is the first Wednesday of the month is also an important part of our worship life together. The Bell Choir also practices various Wednesday evenings during the month.

It is good to know that our church is a place where people are welcomed, helped, and inspired. Jesus tells us in Matthew 5:16, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in Heaven."

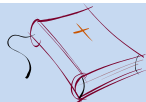

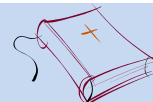
The Deacons thank everyone for serving as ushers and greeters. If you cannot serve on the date assigned, please let the office know so the correct names appear in the bulletin.

Being a Christian isn't easy. Sustaining belief without any doubts for one's entire life is a very rare accomplishment. Indeed, many would say that examining one's faith at least once is a central part of the Christian condition. In this landmark work, esteemed theologian Paul F. Knitter explains the unique path that he took to overcome his doubts, becoming a stronger Christian in the process.

Honest and unflinching, 'Without Buddha I Could not be a Christian' narrates each spiritual dilemma that Knitter has struggled with and explains how a Buddhist worldview has allowed him to resolve each one. From the 'petitioning' nature of Christian prayer to how Christianity views life after death, Knitter argues that a Buddhist standpoint can help inspire a more person-centered conception of Christianity, where individual religious experience comes first, and liturgy and tradition second. Moving and revolutionary, this edition comes with a new postscript in which Professor Knitter reflects on and re-evaluates his position as a double-belonger.

Moderator's Listening Sessions - The five "listening sessions" held throughout the Presbytery this summer drew 55 pastors, church leaders and congregants from 18 POG churches to share their thoughts and experience fellowship. A formal written report will be given at the November Presbytery meeting in Corning.
